

# Saving water match up game




Tap into water education

1. Print and cut the pictures and facts on the next page into cards.
2. Explain to students that half the cards have an example of water being wasted, and half the cards have a solution to that problem. They will need to find the student with the matching card and stand together.
3. Distribute one card per student and give them some time to find their matches.
4. Go around the room and check the matches, and if everyone agrees they are correct. Discuss the water waste examples and how common they are in the community.

Scaffold by having a discussion about which cards describe problems, and which ones are solutions, and how we can identify the differences.

You can make the game more challenging by having students describe their cards only, rather than showing each other.



Tap left running for animals.	Fill a bowl of water for animals. Turn off the tap.	Puddle from a broken water pipe in the road.	Report leaks to SA Water.
A tap is leaky even when turned off.	Tell your teacher or an adult so they can have the tap fixed.	Toilet flush keeps running and refilling.	Tell a grown up so the toilet can be fixed.
Long showers.	Have a 4-minute shower.	Playing with water from the fire hose in the summer.	Save water for emergencies and turn off the tap. Use the community pool instead.
Tap left on while brushing your teeth.	Turn the tap off when not using water.	Sprinklers in the garden left on all the time.	Water the garden or lawn only for one hour, at night
Air conditioner is leaking water.	Tell an adult so they can get the air conditioner fixed.	A tap at school isn't turned off properly.	Turn the tap off properly so there are no drips.
